Jason Rylander has been praised by the *Washington Post* for his "strong, clear tenor" and for performances that "coupled sonorous warmth and emotional depth." He has performed with some of the East Coast's leading early music ensembles, including the Washington Bach Consort, Bach Sinfonia, Cathedra, Mountainside Baroque, Opera Lafayette, and the TENET/Green Mountain Project.
