The Partnership in Action: Exemplar: Latrine Project

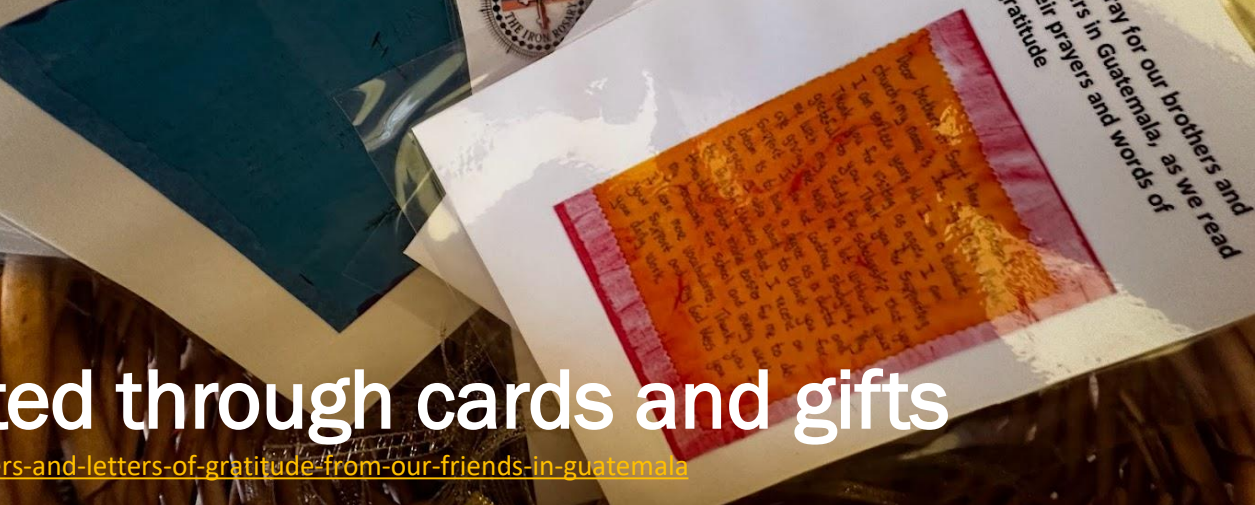
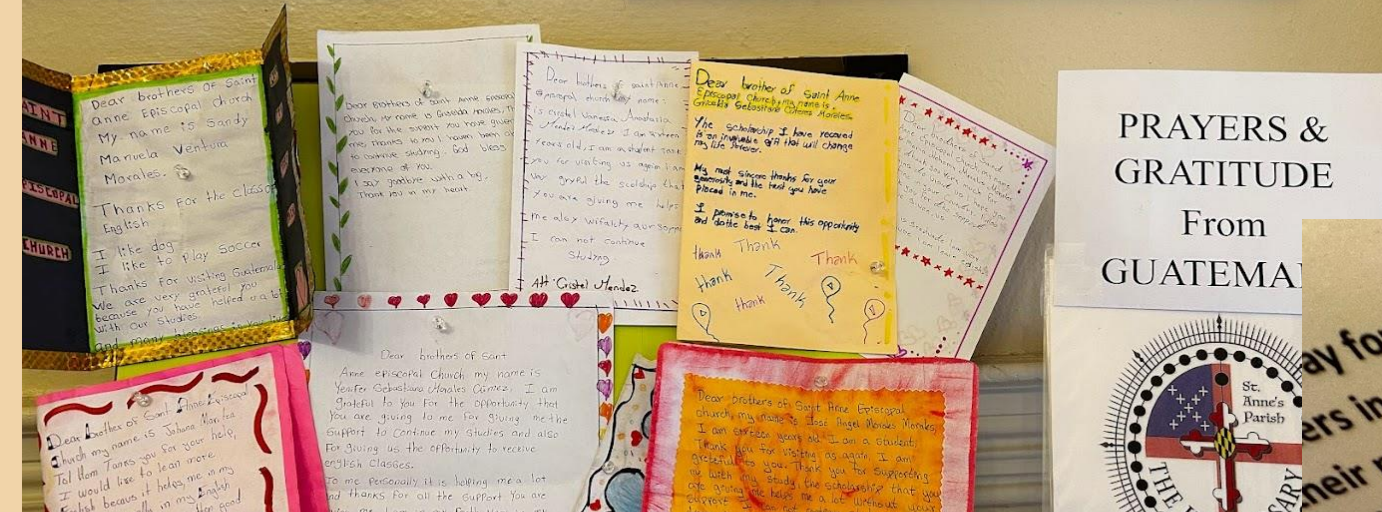
St. Anne's Part: Purchase materials
